



SECZ Sweeps Resume - On Wednesday, July 28, 2020, the Los Angeles City Council voted to resume CARE+ sweeps in the Special Enforcement and Cleanup Zones around “A Bridge Home” shelters. The four Councilmembers who voted no were **Mike Bonin, Marqueece Harris-Dawson, David Ryu** and **Herb Wesson**. **Ryu** and **Wesson**, whose districts include parts of Ktown, **said they would not enforce SECZ sweeps in the neighborhood.**

Inside these zones, unhoused people are subject to increased criminalization and policing. Their belongings are seized, searched without warrant and often destroyed. Anyone who cannot get a bed at a shelter will be at risk of property destruction, arrest and police violence. Before the vote, we asked three unhoused neighbors living in Ktown to describe their experience with sweeps.

*The city seized **Jorge's** belongings in a sweep. This is his experience trying to get his belongings back.* “I went to the city when that happened because my belongings. I went to the City to find out where this was and they said they put it in storage and I said that’s great and so when I went on there and when I went over there, they just have a big pile, so how do you [know] where is my belongings?”

***Jade** experienced a sweep on New Year’s Day.* “I had presents for my mom and a bunch of things—I even saved up for that. On New Year’s Day at 7 am, the city came and took everything—my tent, everything. I only had a backpack starting New Year’s and that really hurt me.”

*And **Edwin** shared how dehumanizing these sweeps can be.* “Sometimes they don’t give us time to collect our items that have sentimental value so that’s what hurts the most. For the most part, we try to maintain the streets clean so we don’t give them a reason to come and take our stuff. But they still move forward on it. I don’t know who’s making that call, but it’s not fair.”

We will keep pressuring our elected leaders to do the right thing by demanding #ServicesNotSweeps.

COP WATCH TIPS



DO NOT TALK TO COPS OR OTHER CITY AGENTS.



TAKE PHOTOS AND VIDEOS OF THE INCIDENT AND ANY TICKETS ISSUED.



RECORD LAPD NAMES/BADGE NUMBERS NUMBER ON SIDE OF CARS, AND DESCRIPTIONS.



GET WITNESS AND/OR VICTIM STATEMENTS W/CONTACT INFORMATION & WRITE YOUR OWN STATEMENT.



TRY TO NOT BECOME PART OF AN INCIDENT OR GET ARRESTED. YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO FILM & DOCUMENT THE POLICE, BUT IF A COP SAYS TO STEP BACK, THEN STEP BACK. USE YOUR OWN BEST JUDGMENT.
