



On Saturday, October 17, the #ServicesNotSweeps coalition along with several other homeless and political advocacy organizations are gathering at Echo Park Lake for an unhoused people's vote rally. The event is led by Theo Henderson, creator and host of the podcast, *We the Unhoused*. Theo himself is currently unhoused. He envisions the rally to be a momentous event to signal the power of unhoused voters. For too long, elected officials and candidates seeking office have regarded the unhoused as non-constituents. This event will force politicians to contend with unhoused people's vote. The rally will center the voices of those with lived experience of homelessness as they talk about issues that are important to them in the upcoming election. Shawn Pleasants, who was homeless in Koreatown for six years, will be one of the speakers.

In addition to speeches from a slate of unhoused leaders, the event offers voter registration and a mock ballot on issues that are important to unhoused Angelenos, such as criminalization and sweeps.

Parking Enforcement Resumes

City Council recently moved to resume enforcement of street parking violations starting October 15. After halting parking enforcement in March due to COVID-19, it makes little sense to resume while LA is still in the midst of a public health crisis.

Starting October 15, the City of LA resumed parking enforcement and impounds when applicable for residential street cleaning, abandoned vehicles (72-hour rule), oversized and overnight

restrictions, peak-hour and anti-gridlock zones, and expired vehicle registrations. Prior to this, the City had already resumed enforcing metered parking, posted time limits, temporary no parking signs, emergency access areas, colored curb zones and city-owned lots. However, the LA Department of Transportation will delay the booting and impounding of scofflaw vehicles (vehicles that

accumulate five or more delinquent citations) until January 1. The City will also suspend imposing new citation late penalties until

October 22.

For vehicles used as dwelling, LA Department of Transportation will report back to the City Council in 30-60 days with a proposed plan. We will provide updates in upcoming zines.
