

## Christmas Eve Sweep Cancelled After Public Outcry

The City of LA scheduled a comprehensive “cleanup” for 6:00am on Christmas Eve in Harbor City. The sweep would have forced over 50 encampment residents to pack up everything and move, a clear violation of CDC guidelines against the displacement of encampment residents. We circulated a picture of the sweep notice on social media, which led to hundreds of people sending angry emails to Mayor Garcetti and other city officials. In response to the backlash, the City of LA cancelled the sweep.

We want to ensure that this is not just a Christmas miracle and that the mayor continues to listen to public guidance, ends sweep displacement, and allows people to shelter in place no matter where their shelter is. Even as one sweep is canceled, displacement and disruption continue to occur across the city due to Special Enforcement and Cleanup Zones (SECZ), and we anticipate future comprehensive cleanups. We continue to call on Mayor Garcetti to stop putting politics before public health, to stop putting the community at risk, and to end all displacement.



## COVID-19 SURGE IN LOS ANGELES COUNTY

The emergency Stay-At-Home ruling is still in effect. Please exercise extreme caution when outside of your shelter. The virus is airborne and highly contagious. You can get infected just from breathing the same air as someone else.

### When outside your shelter:



- **Limit contact with others.**
- **Keep your distance from others.**
- **Wear a face mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times.**
- **Wash or sanitize your hands frequently.**

On Dec. 24th, there were 13,678 new cases and 145 deaths. **Please be very, very careful and protective of your health.** Every hospital is flooded with COVID-19 patients. Wait times for emergency medical care can exceed 8 hours.

**Kheir Clinic** can provide no-cost COVID-19 testing to uninsured patients. Testing is available by appointment only. Please call or text (213) 637-1080 to enroll as a patient, and then you can set up an appointment to test for COVID-19.

## Dear Neighbor,

It's been an extraordinary year, full of loss and heartbreak and anger. In the midst of this hardship, we have seen many different communities pull together. We don't know what will happen next year, but we do have reasons to hope that the future will look brighter.

You may be wondering about us— the people who come nearly every week to drop off supplies. We are your neighbors, and we want to help. We're part of **Ktown for All**, an all-volunteer community organization started in 2018. We focus on two things:

1. **Providing direct material aid**, like food, toiletries, tents, clothing, and tarps.
2. **Political advocacy**, to fight against unjust laws that make it a crime to be homeless, and to push for regulations that protect tenants, as well expand supportive services and affordable housing.

We have had some major victories this year. We got the City of LA to stop destroying bulky items and to back off on the enforcement of CARE+ sweeps. We helped make it legal to sleep in your car again, and forced city hall to shelve their proposal to outlaw sitting/sleeping/lying down outside.

We also have faced losses. The mayor has refused to implement meaningful renter protections. The city's eviction moratorium will expire on Dec. 31st. Many, many more people will face homelessness after the New Year.

Ktown for All knows that **housing ends homelessness**— not tickets or handcuffs. We have more work to do. We invite you to join us in our organizing and advocacy, and fight back against the inhumane policies enacted by the city.
