



## NEW SHELTER OPEN AT SHATTO REC CENTER

A new shelter for unhoused residents opened inside the recreation center at Shatto Park on Wednesday, January 6th. The shelter, which is run by Salvation Army, has 48 beds spaced appropriately to maintain COVID-19 distancing protocols, and is open for intake on a first-come first-serve basis. Everyone is eligible for entry.

### Here is what we know so far:

- Residents are limited to 2 bags of personal property. No storage is available for additional personal belongings.
- There are 3 meals served per day.
- Ins and outs are allowed, up until curfew (7pm).
- Residents are allowed to stay at the center during the day, and do not have to sign up for a new bed every day.
- There are daily temperature checks and screenings for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Showers are not available on-site, but transportation will be provided twice weekly to showers at a nearby YMCA.

## COVID-19 SURGE IN LOS ANGELES WORSENS

Currently, over 8,000 new people are hospitalized for COVID-19 in Los Angeles every day. LA is beginning vaccine distribution, but the roll-out is slow and will likely take months. Please exercise **extreme caution** when outside of your shelter. The virus is airborne and highly contagious. You can get infected simply by breathing the same air as someone else.

### When outside your shelter:










- **Limit contact with others.**
- **Keep your distance from others.**
- **Wear a face mask that covers your nose and mouth at all times.**
- **Wash or sanitize your hands frequently.**

On January 6th, there were 11,841 new cases and 258 deaths. **Please be very, very careful and protective of your health.**

### LA County is now offering COVID-19 Medical Sheltering to residents in need of a safe place to isolate and quarantine.

## OUR NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION: TO KEEP PUSHING BACK AGAINST SWEEPS

Last month, Los Angeles City Council members voted to resume CARE+ sweeps across Council District 15 (which includes San Pedro, Harbor City, and Watts), in direct defiance of CDC pandemic guidelines. In response, the Services Not Sweeps coalition mobilized concerned citizens all across Los Angeles to bombard Mayor Garcetti and other elected officials with emails, tweets, and phone calls each week, demanding that they call off scheduled CARE+ sweeps at encampment locations in District 15. The public pressure worked, and we successfully blocked the sweeps scheduled for the last two weeks of December.

However, on the morning of January 4th, despite the fact that over 2,000 Angelenos had sent emails specifically begging Los Angeles officials to cancel the sweep, city sanitation workers and LAPD descended upon an encampment of 60 residents in Harbor City and forcibly displaced them. We are deeply, deeply disappointed in CD 15 Councilman Buscaino, in the council members who voted with him, and in Mayor Garcetti for electing to continue displacing unhoused residents with violent sweeps during this pandemic. Until these officials make better decisions, we will continue to increase public pressure against them, and ultimately we will see them voted out of office for their callous disregard for the health and safety of our city.
